

# **Project Success**

# **Project Success Criteria**

- The overall success or failure of a project is evaluated against success criteria:
  - On time
  - On budget
  - Meeting the scope
  - High quality
  - Client satisfaction
  - •
- Success criteria should be set before the project starts

# **Project Success**

### **Project Success Factors**

- Factors which have to be in place for the project to meet its success criteria
  - Competent project management team
  - Robust cost management system
  - Well defined schedule
  - Effective risk management
  - Senior management support
  - Efficient communication
  - Good quality assurance and control
  - ..

# **Project Success**

### **Project Success vs. Project Management Success**

- Project success: The project's final product will meet its objectives (fit for purpose)
- Project management success: The project is executed well (according to time, cost, scope, safety, quality, ... requirements)

  - The project was cancelled!

### **Stakeholders**

### **Project Stakeholders**

- A stakeholder is a person, a group, or an organization that has direct or indirect stake or interest in a project because it can influence on or be affected by the project's actions, objectives, outcomes and policies.
- Examples of stakeholders:
  - End-users or clients, designers, contractors
  - The entities who fund or approve a project
  - Suppliers
  - Opponents to the project


### **Project Stakeholders Classification**


- Individuals/ groups/ entities

- Positive/ negative


### **Stakeholders**

### **Project Stakeholders Management**

- Managing stakeholders increases chance of success
- Identify stakeholders at early stages of the project and get them involved, ask them to help when required
- Prioritize them according to their influence and interest
- Make sure you listen to them and keep them informed; have your communication plan ready
- Understanding their concerns and needs improves the quality of the project deliverables
- You need to bring stakeholders in your side
- Inform them about project closure and thank them









# **Project Organization**


### **Project Team**


- The project manager leads the project
- Project management team including project manager assistants, planning and control manager and other managers assist the project manager to lead the project
- Technical team, including subject matter experts generate the final product
- The project sponsor (champion) supports the project manager and protects the project against fluctuations in the mother organization

# Project Organization Types of Organization Functional Project Matrix Strong Balanced Weak











### **Governance**

 Set of policies and regulations, processes and procedures, and responsibilities and accountabilities that define the establishment, management and control of projects, programs and portfolios



### **Project Management Office (PMO)**

- A PMO is a permanent department responsible for improving project management within an organization
- A PMO can provide a wide range of services to projects from supporting them to completely direct and execute them:
  - identifying and resolving common problems across projects
  - standardizing project management processes and tools
  - improving project management capabilities and skills
  - monitoring and reporting on project status
  - reducing the cost of projects
  - improving project success



# **Types of PMO**

- Supportive PMO
  - The most common type of PMO
  - Supporting projects through training, mentoring, administration and reporting
  - Suitable type to start a PMO in an organization

# **Types of PMO**

- Controlling PMO
  - Supportive services
  - · Controlling services such as project reviews, audits and assessments
  - Enforcing standards, implementing processes and managing overall project risk
  - The PMO can influence project delivery

# **Types of PMO**

- Directive PMO
  - The least common, but sometimes most effective type of PMO
  - Supporting, controlling and directing projects
  - The PMO is the home of project managers
  - Project managers report to the PMO Director as their supervisor
